



## BYPASS DRYLICK

- BYPASS DRYLICK is a low cost drylick for sheep and cattle on a low quality roughage diet. Plenty of roughage is essential.
- BYPASS DRYLICK is a supplement designed to feed the rumen bugs and stimulate feed intake.

### Ingredients

Vegetable protein meals, lime, salt, bentonite, sulphate of ammonia, urea, vitamin and mineral premix.

### Analysis

### Planned Supplement Intakes

	Cattle	Sheep
Initial period	50-70g/hd/day	8-12g/hd/day
On full urea	100-150g/hd/day	15-25g/hd/day

### Feeding BYPASS DRYLICK

#### Cattle

Cut a 200 litre drum in half between the 2 rings to form a vertical side tub. This way if it happens to rain on the supplement the drum will only catch what falls directly in to it, unlike a trough which has a funnel effect. The half drum should be adequate for approximately 40 adults cows.

#### Sheep

Cut out one side of a square plastic drum and lay over. This way if it happens to rain on the supplement the drum will only catch what falls directly in to it, unlike a trough which has a funnel effect. The drum should be adequate for approximately 40 adult sheep.

## Rules for feeding **BYPASS DRYLICK** to sheep and cattle

### Urea is toxic if...

- The rumen is not adjusted
- It is not fed **CONSTANTLY**
- It becomes liquefied in a trough or a block

### Therefore...

1. Start urea intake slowly. This is particularly important for sheep.
2. Maintain access to the supplement **100% of the time**.
3. Use drums for **BYPASS DRYLICK** as explained above in suggested feeding method.
4. There should be adequate drums available for the number of animals.
5. **Remove any salt cravings before feeding **BYPASS DRYLICK****

Salt may act either as an intake inhibitor or an attachment. It is important to know which it is before starting **BYPASS DRYLICK**. Feed out some straight salt to start with to test the animals reaction. If they really get into the salt, continue until salt cravings are reduced.

## Rules specifically for sheep

Sheep are much more sensitive to urea than cattle, so extra caution must be taken to avoid losses. It is very important to measure the intake of supplement across the mob. When there is an increase in supplement intake (e.g. Up to 40-50g/hd/day) the urea level can be raised from 8-10%. Extreme caution must be practised when the urea level in a sheep exceeds 16%.
